Introduction

This guide provides essential information related to the work and activities of the Department of Palestinian Affairs (DPA), its role in supervising Palestinian refugee camps and the provision of care thereto since 1948, along with data relevant to these camps.

There are thirteen such camps within the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan distributed over six governorates. DPA runs the affairs of these camps along with UNRWA.

Director General Word



The Palestinian issue is a top priority and interest of the Jordanian government and Jordanian policy in general. Today, Jordan hosts about 2.4 million Palestinian refugees registered with UNRWA, which represents 42% of Palestinian refugees registered with UNRWA in its five fields of operations. Jordan was one of the first countries which received the initial wave of Palestinian refugees that accompanied the establishment of the Israeli occupation following the Arab-Israeli war in 1948.

Over the past seven decades, the directives of the Hashemite leadership have been to support Palestinian refugees politically and with the provision of services and relief. This has become a fundamental tenet for the government, while it also collaborates in this regard with many donors and international partners, most notably UNRWA; a major partner.

DPA was established in 1988 as a successor to a number of official institutions established by successive Jordanian governments since 1948 to provide humanitarian aid and relief to Palestinian refugees. DPA is guided by a strategic vision that encompasses two major aspects: following up the developments of the Palestinian issue in a manner that is compatible to the interests of the Jordanian state and connected thereto, and providing its best to serve the Palestinian refugee community within the kingdom according to available resources. This includes building active partnerships with international donors and most notably its major partner; UNRWA.

This guide contains a set of data related to the thirteen Palestinian refugees camps in the Kingdom, we hope that it will provide the necessary information to the beneficiaries and partners regarding a large percentage of the Palestinian refugee community in the Kingdom who reside in these camps.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my deepest thanks and appreciation for the efforts exerted by the assigned team to complete this guide.

Historical overview of DPA:

DPA is considered a continuation of other official institutions that were established to serve Palestinian refugees. Based on royal directives, number of such entities were established, including the following:

(1) Ministry of Refugee Affairs:

This ministry was established in 1949 pursuant to directives by the late King Abdullah I to provide care and assistance to Palestinian refugees displaced from their homes.

(2) Ministry of Construction and Restoration:

This ministry was established in 1950 pursuant to directives by the late King Abdullah I and entrusted with the responsibility of taking care of the affairs of Palestinian refugees in the Kingdom.

The ministry worked tirelessly to improve the living conditions of refugees, contributing to the establishment of Palestinian refugee camps on both banks of the Jordan River and exerting immense efforts in the educational, health and social domains, in cooperation with other governmental institutions and agencies such as UNRWA.

(3) Higher Ministerial Committee on the Affairs of the Occupied Territories:

This committee was formed after 1967 under the chair of the late King Hussein bin Talal. It included nine ministers, and supervised the affairs of the West Bank and displaced persons after the 1967 war.

(4) Executive Office for the Affairs of the Occupied Territories:

It was established in 1972 as a secretariat of the Higher Committee and attached to the Council of Ministers.

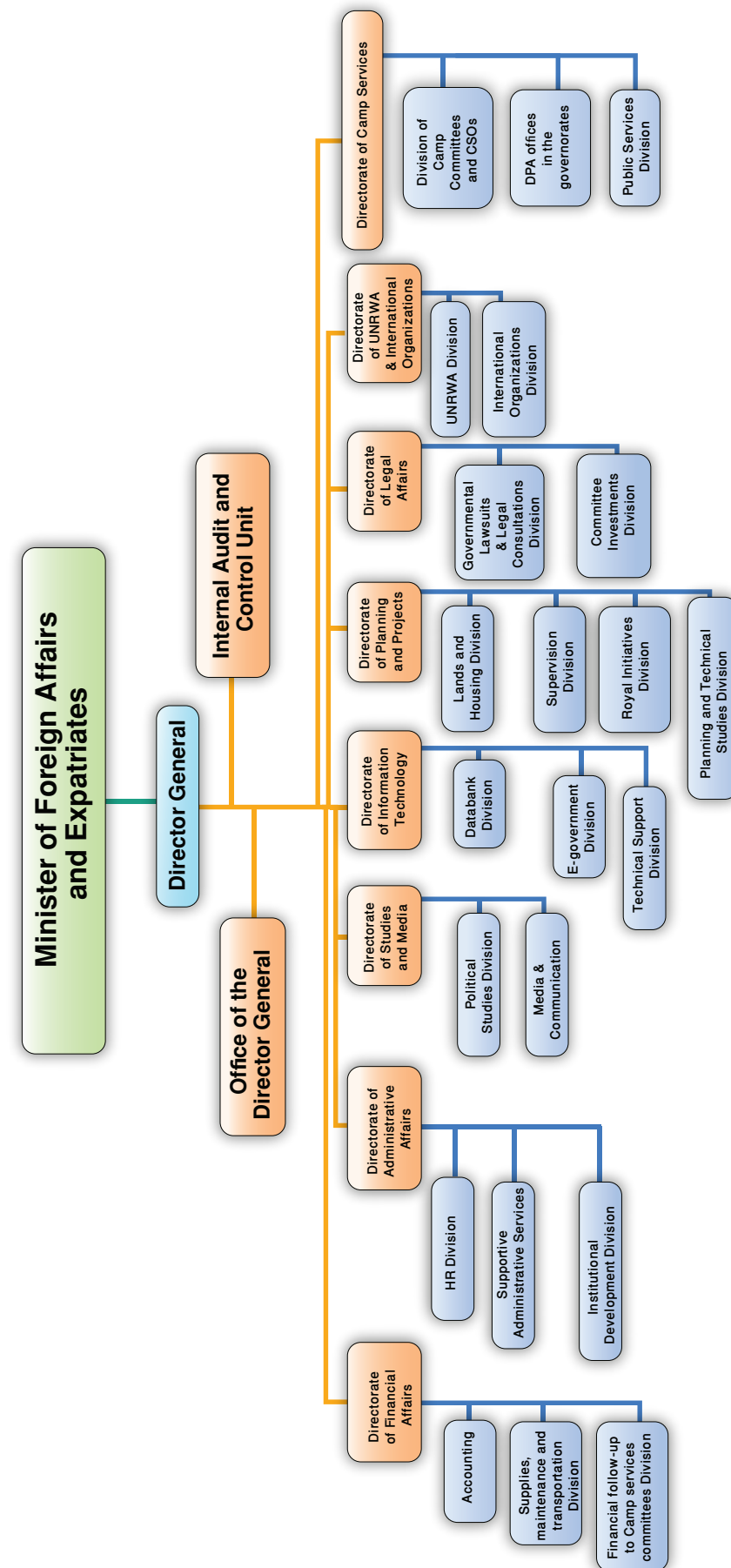
(5) Ministry of Occupied Territory Affairs:

This ministry was founded in 1980 to replace the Ministry of Construction and the Executive Office for the Care of the Affairs of Refugees and the Displaced.

(6) Department of Palestinian Affairs:

After the legal and administrative disengagement with the West Bank in 1988, the Ministry of Affairs for the Occupied Territories was disbanded and DPA was established to supervise and address the affairs of Palestinian refugees and the displaced in Jordan.

Organizational Structure



DPA's Tasks and services

Tasks and responsibilities of DPA:

- Supervising the affairs of refugees and the displaced and managing the affairs of the camps.
- Supervising the activities and programs of UNRWA and enhancing partnerships with international donors.
- Follow-up, study and analysis of matters relating to the Palestinian issue at the Arab, Islamic and international levels.

Main services:

- Working to maintain the infrastructure of Palestinian refugee camps in collaboration with the ministries and concerned government institutions.
- Facilitating the work, activities and programs of international organizations and NGOs especially UNRWA, to improve the living conditions of the Palestinian refugee community. This is done in coordination with all relevant parties while searching also for new partnerships and enhancing current ones.
- Demonstrating diplomatic, political and technical efforts to support the Palestinian issue locally, regionally and internationally in accordance with international legitimacy resolutions.
- Following the latest developments on the Palestinian issue and the study and analysis thereof, and issuing studies related thereto, in addition to following the developments of the peace process and Israeli violations, especially in Jerusalem, and providing the relevant entities with these information.

DPA's strategy 2022-2024

Vision:

Better service to the Palestinian refugee community in Jordan and the Palestinian issue in line with the interests of Jordan.

Mission:

Enhancing the living, service and development conditions of the Palestinian refugee community in Jordan and contributing to highlighting the Jordanian role in support of the Palestinian issue in accordance with the available resources and through building effective and sustainable partnerships.

Historical overview of the camps



In 1948 and after the first Arab-Israeli war broke out, 750 thousand Palestinians fled their properties and homeland as a result of forced displacement by the Israeli forces against the Palestinians. Jordan received the largest number of refugees whether in the East Bank or the West Bank of the Jordan River, before disengagement with the West Bank took place.

In 1967, and as a result of the Israeli occupation of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, another wave of displacement to Jordan occurred. The number of displaced was estimated at that time to be 250 thousand persons. Around half of them were refugees living in the camps of the West Bank or the Gaza Strip, and were forced to become refugees again in less than twenty years.

During the years that followed the occupation of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, waves of displacement continued to Jordan due to the policies and practices of the Israeli occupation. So military deportation orders, destruction of Palestinian homes and villages and other practices, whether at the military or economic levels, led to the displacement of thousands of Palestinians towards Jordan.

This displacement resulted in a large burden on the host countries and especially in the humanitarian dimension, in regards to providing shelter and clothing. Since the expectations at that time were that the refugees would soon return to their homeland, the camps initially were constructed with simple and temporarily-lasting materials which were tents. Jordan, in collaboration with UNRWA, contributed to the establishment of these camps in both the East and West Bank.

With the refugee issue continuing and their inability to return home, the need arose to provide them with appropriate housing. Accordingly, at the start, permanent accommodations were constructed using tin and bricks. Over time, these accommodations were developed further and were built with concrete materials and bricks.

Official UNRWA statistics indicate that the number of Palestinian refugees in Jordan up till 2020 was 2.4 million refugees, which is 42% of the total number of refugees registered with the agency in its five fields of operations (Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip).

Refugee camps in Jordan

The Palestinian refugees in Jordan represent the highest percentage of Palestinian refugees registered in the UNRWA fields of operations, distributed throughout thirteen camps in the different governorates of the kingdom.

According to UNRWA's definition, the camp is a plot of land placed at the disposal of UNRWA's control by the host government in order to accommodate the Palestinian refugees and set up facilities to address their needs.

However, regarding the plots of land that were not allocated specifically for this purpose, the Agency does not consider them as official camps. As such, UNRWA recognizes only 10 official camps in Jordan. These are Zarqa, Hitteen, Wehdat, Hussein, Talbiyyeh, Baqa'a, Irbid, Martyr Azmi Mufti, Souf and Jerash camps. The agency provides all of its services in these camps only.

As for the remaining three camps, which are Madaba, Prince Hasan and Sukhneh, UNRWA considers them unofficial. In these camps, UNRWA provides different services except collecting garbage. Also there is no office for the UNRWA or anyone who undertakes the tasks of UNRWA camp director. UNRWA also does not have names records for the beneficiaries of the housing units inside these three camps.

In the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, camps are distributed through six governorates as follows:

- * Balqa Governorate that includes Baqa'a Camp.
- * The Capital and Madaba which include Wehdat, Hussein, Prince Hasan, Talbiyyeh and Madaba camps.
- * Zarqa Governorate that includes Zarqa, Hitteen, and Sukhneh camps.
- * Irbid Governorate and it includes Irbid and Martyr Azmi Mufti camps.
- * Jerash Governorate, including Jerash and Souf camps.

In order to provide the best services to the camps' residents throughout the kingdom, DPA works through its offices in various governorates in accordance with regulations that organize the construction processes and distribution of permits and public services throughout the camps. DPA works hand in hand with the services committees in the camps. These committees are voluntary civilian bodies that are formed and whose tasks are determined according to instructions specific thereto. The latest set of such instructions relating to the formation of camp service committees in the kingdom was issued in 2019.

DPA also coordinates as necessary with the competent institutions to implement infrastructure projects in the camps, including the following:

1. Sewage networks for camps as needed.

2. Complete water networks as needed.
3. Networks of rainwater drainage.
4. Works for general lighting as needed, which require maintenance and other works in order to preserve public safety in coordination with the electricity companies in charge in every camp.
5. Works on retaining walls as necessary in areas that pose a threat to public safety.
6. Works for maintaining asphalt roads and the paved entrances to the camps.

Currently, the infrastructure in the camps is good and complete with the exception of the following camps:

1. Sukhneh Camp which requires the following:

- A sewage network and a lift (pumping) station.
- Works for maintaining asphalt roads and paved entrances to the camp.
- A network for rainwater drainage.

2. Jerash Camp which requires the following:

- A network for rainwater drainage.

In addition, the camp service committees annually implement maintenance projects for the infrastructure in the camps within the designated allocations, especially in regards to maintaining asphalt roads, concrete pavements and lines for rainwater drainage.

The most prominent challenges facing the camps:

- Unemployment and difficulties in finding a job, especially amongst the youth.
- High graduates number compared to available jobs.
- Narrow streets and people trespassing on the roads inside the camp which causes traffic jams.
- Unavailability of parking lots inside several camps.
- The need for regular maintenance of streets, sidewalks and residences.
- Random street vendor stalls inside camp.
- Over crowdedness inside the camp.
- Unavailability of public spaces in some camps.
- Lack of productive projects or enterprises.

The Hashemite royal family pays a great attention to the Palestinian camps through the royal initiatives that cover all of these camps.

These initiatives include allocating seats in public universities for the camps students (i.e. 350 of them), and the distribution of charity packages for poor. The royal initiatives also cover the infrastructure sector, which include the establishment of comprehensive developmental centers and sports fields for youth. All of this has a huge and direct impact on improving the living conditions in the camps. Further, there are royal directives to the government to provide interest and care to the Palestinian refugee camps to improve their living conditions and sustain the infrastructure and services provided

to them. Thus, DPA provides services and implement projects that alleviate the suffering of these refugees in the thirteen camps. These include infrastructure services with regard to roads and rainwater drainage. DPA works continuously, through the services committees, to maintain these services within the available resources and in coordination with other governmental entities such as the Ministry of Public Works and Housing, the Greater Amman Municipality and the municipalities adjacent to these camps. There are also projects implemented by international donors in all the camps.

United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East(UNRWA)



On November 29, 1947, the second session of the UN General Assembly issued a resolution to partition Palestine into two states; a Jewish and an Arab state. Due to the actions of Jewish/Zionist organizations following the failing partition plan and the end of the era of the British mandate in Palestine, hundreds of thousands of Palestinian residents were forced to flee for their lives from their lands, their lands. The UN established an organization named the “UN Commission for the Relief of Palestinian Refugees” in November 1948, to provide assistance to the Palestinian refugees and coordinate the services provided to them by NGOs and other UN agencies.

UNRWA

This important international humanitarian organization was established pursuant to UN General Assembly Resolution No. 302 in its fourth session on December 8, 1949, to address the consequences of the forced displacement undertaken by Jewish Zionist organizations against the people of Palestine, after their aggressive war in 1948.

Funding of the agency:

UNRWA benefits from the generous funding of UN member states, in addition to funding by regional governments and several international bodies such as the EU.

UNRWA services

Responsibility of the agency in the camps

UNRWA's responsibility in the camps is limited to the provision of services and managing its facilities.

UNRWA runs an office for services in each camp. The camp residents go to this office to update their data or discuss issues relating to the Agency's services, and take them up with the office's director, who in turn refers the issues to the Agency's administration in the region where the camp is located.

UNRWA provides humanitarian services, which include primary and vocational education, primary healthcare, relief and social services, infrastructure and camp improvement, microfinance and emergency response. These services are provided through the following programs: education, health, relief and social services, protection, microfinance and infrastructure and camps improvement.

According to the agency's annual report of 2020, UNRWA provided basic education to 118,296 students, including Palestinian refugees arriving from Syria, in 169 schools, in addition to providing technical and vocational training and education to 3081 youth.



refugee children from Syria and Syrian refugee children were served through the network of UNRWA schools.

Through 25-health centers, the Agency provided 1.128 million consultations in primary healthcare during 2020. Through the social safety network program, cash based transfers were delivered to 59,308 refugees. In addition, the Agency rehabilitated 32 housing units and provided 7,199 microfinance loans to a total value of 6 million and 241 thousand US dollars.

UNRWA continued to provide humanitarian assistance to 17,687 Palestinian refugees who fled from Syria to Jordan. This included providing the basic needs to 16,571 of them, while 460 Palestinian refugees from Syria received one-off emergency cash grants to help them respond to specific protection concerns.

Further, medical services were delivered. This included secondary and tertiary care for 11,659 Palestinian refugees from Syria, while the educational needs of 1,063 Palestinian

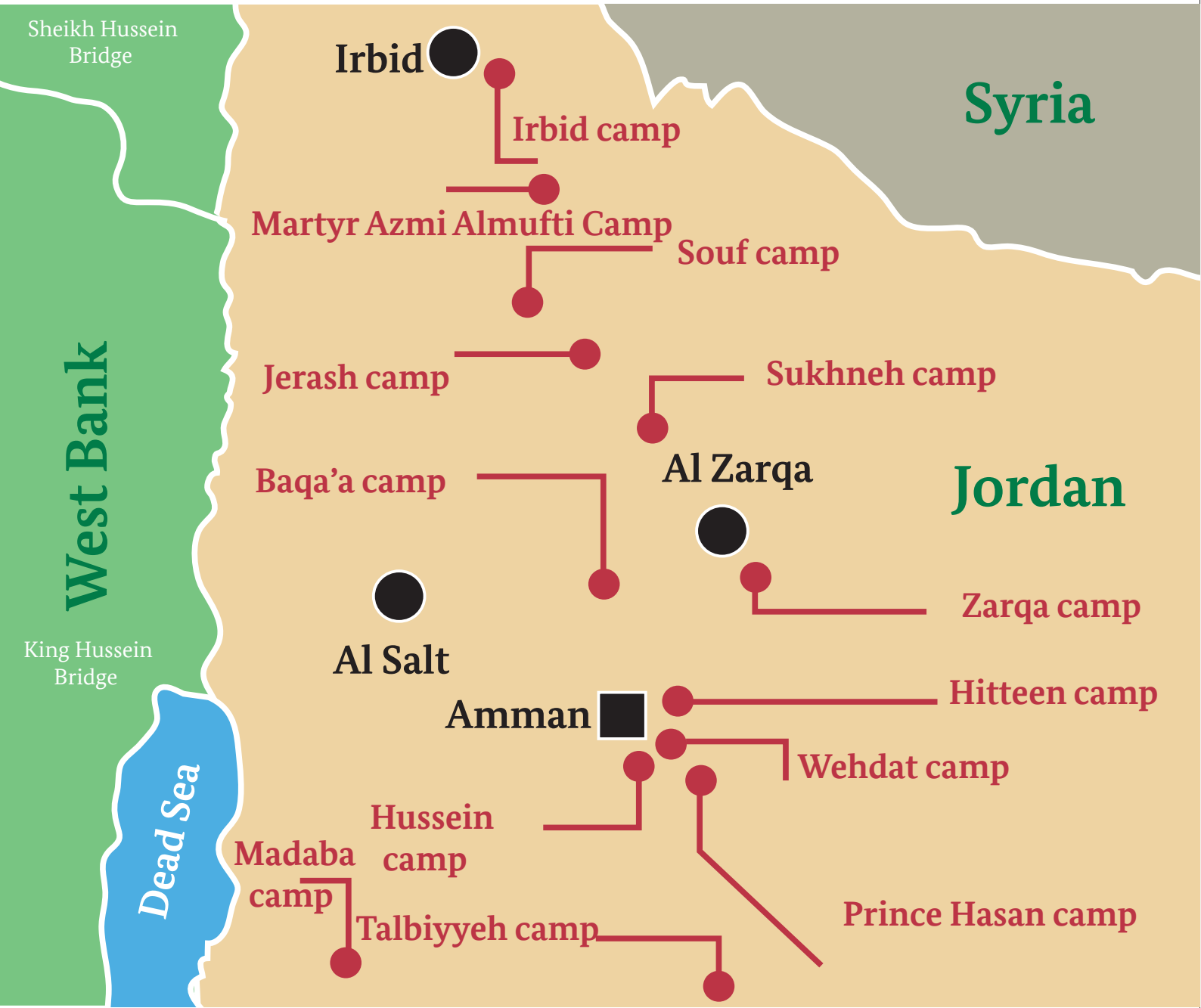

Map of the distribution of camps in Jordan



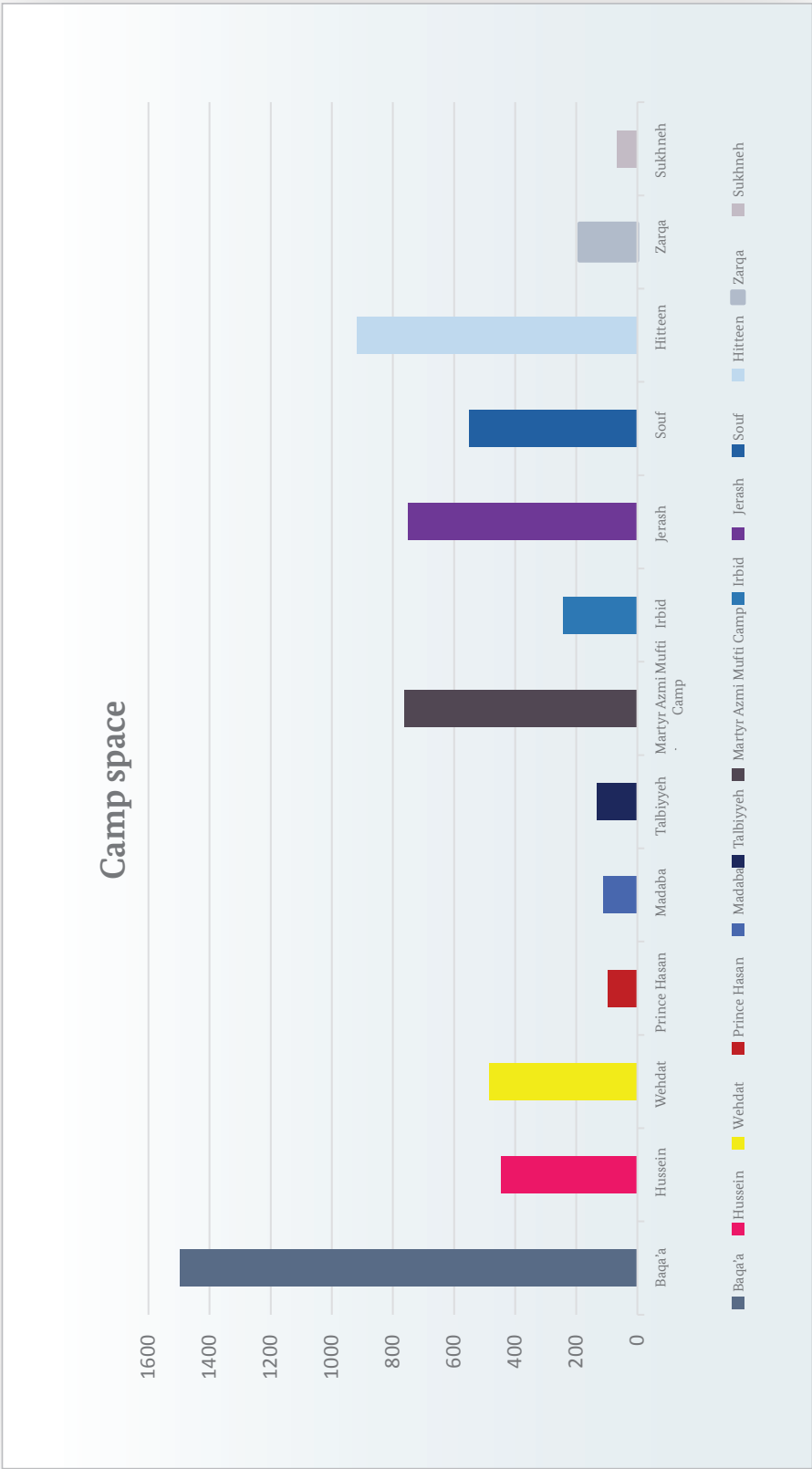

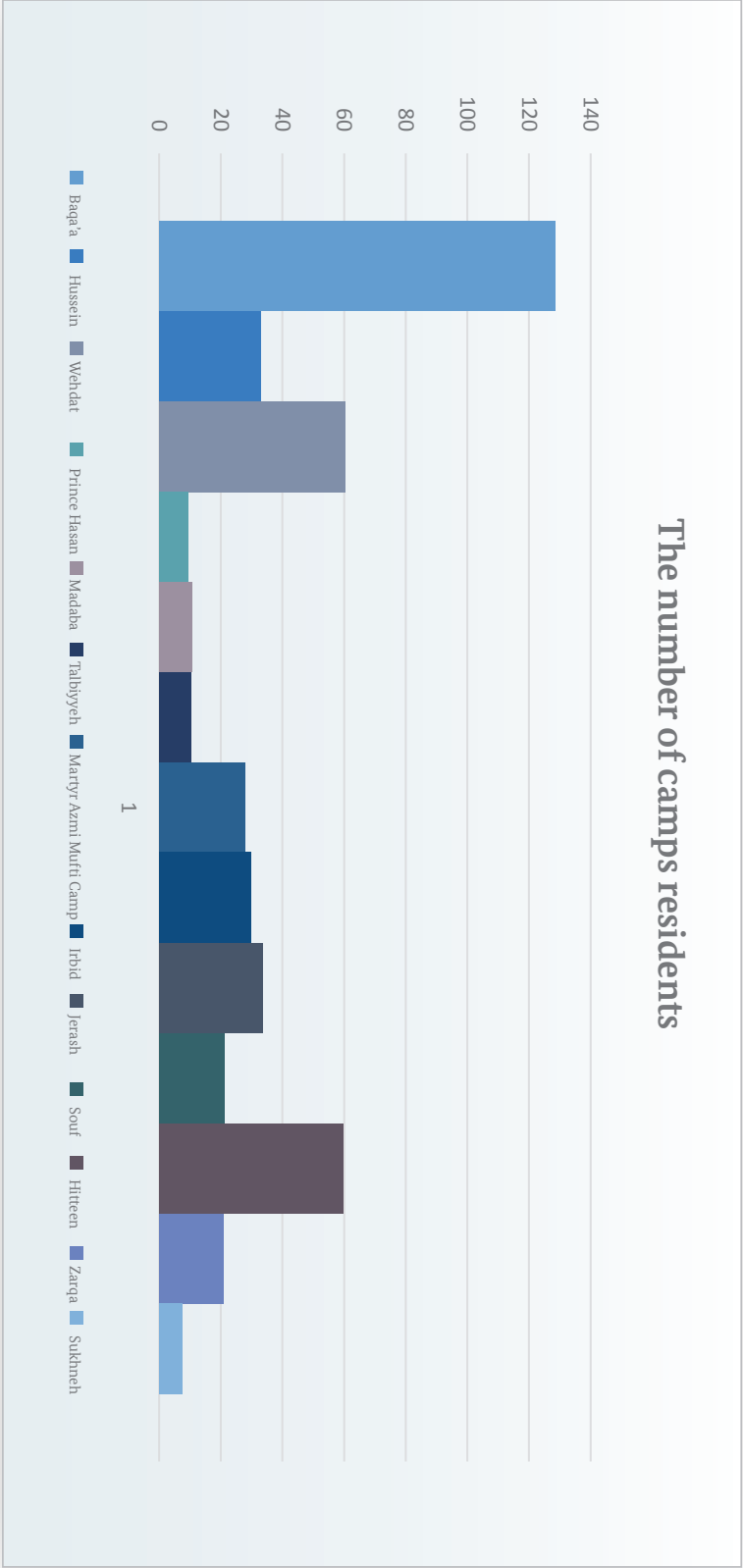
